A *word* FROM SPIRITUAL LIFE

The mission of the Children's Home is to *Empower children and families to experience the transforming love of Christ through evidence-based care and holistic services*. And one of the values of the Children's Home that sets us apart is our commitment to holistic care, which includes spiritual care. Within the first few weeks of their arrival on our campus, I meet with each youth to learn about their spiritual background. During this conversation I always explain that my role is to care for the spiritual part of their being, whatever that looks like for them individually. Something I train our staff about is that some of our youth have experienced spiritual abuse and trauma, so giving them control over what spiritual care looks like for them is the most gracious and Christ-like act we can do. We also make arrangements for youth whose faith background is a religion other than Christianity.

I also inform our youth that I am just one member of an awesome team including house parents, therapists, teachers, recreation staff, who are all working together to make sure all their needs are met so they can grow and heal while in our care. . The Spiritual Life staff work closely with our house parents, therapists, and recreation staff to provide additional support for our youth and to reinforce therapeutic goals.

Our primary goal in the Spiritual Life department is to foster opportunities for the youth in our care to experience God in a tangible way through worship, service, and fellowship. The chapel team is constantly listening to our youth, and developing innovate ways to provide spiritual care that will meet the needs of our youth where they are while they are with us. So in addition to Sunday morning worship and Wednesday youth group, we have organized activities such as discussion groups, theater productions, praise band, dance, music lessons, music production, and talent shows. We see all of these as opportunities to form our youth spiritually, teach positive coping skills, and empower our youth to see themselves as capable and gifted people, because they are!

If I could share one thing with you about our youth, it is that they have faith and resilience that is unmatched. They often remind me what it is to believe. They carry with them an optimism that miracles are possible here and now. While many terrible things have happened to our youth, it is my honor to witness the beautifully and wonderfully made people God created them to be and to see them grow and begin to discover purpose in their lives.

Thank you for supporting our work and may you be filled with joy knowing the immeasurable impact your contributions make in the lives of our young people.

DEDICATION OF THE GILMARTIN OUTDOOR CHAPEL

Debbie Preacher and her family were looking for a way to honor the memory of her parents, Peter and Catherine Gilmartin, as well as her brother, Peter James Gilmartin. Construction of the chapel was completed in the spring, just in time for the youth to hold Palm Sunday services. Mrs. Preacher spoke as part of the dedication program and explained how she was molded by her mother's example. "Their love lives on. My brother, Peter wrote that passage. I thought he so eloquently captured the essence of who our parents were and the life lesson they taught us. My mom's love of children, especially those in need, ran to the core of who she was and how she lived her life. I recently read a quote from an unknown author that struck me. It said, 'Love doesn't die, people do.' Their love lives on."

MORE THAN A CHIL

Through the leadership of the Methodist Episcopal Church, the Florida United Methodist Children's Home was founded in 1908 as the Florida Methodist Orphanage. From those humble beginnings with just two orphaned children, the Children's Home quickly grew.

During the Great Depression of the 1930's, the Children's Home grew much of its own food, tended dairy cattle, and raised a variety of animals as it cared for as many as 150 children. In 1939, the name was changed to The Florida Methodist Children's Home.

As time progressed, the needs of the children in our care began to change. Their emotional and psychological needs required a higher level of clinical care and attention, so the traditional orphanage was no longer the desired model. During the 1950's the first two cottages were built as a more family-style group care model was pursued. Since that time, several residential cottages have been built that allows us to group the children in accordance with their age and treatment needs.

When a youth turns 18, they age out of the group home or foster care system and are deemed adults. However, most of these youth are not prepared to be completely independent. Located on the Enterprise campus, our Independent Living program assists young adults 18-26 as they transition to adult life. This program provides them with a safe place to live and counseling to help them improve their budgeting and other life skills. While in the program, these young adults are attending college or trade school and are usually employed with a local business. Young adults in this program have transitioned into careers in law enforcement, health care, construction, the military, and many other fields.

The Children's Home also screens, trains, and license foster parents in four counties, providing children the opportunity to transition into foster care. The foster parents are continually supported by Children's Home staff through additional training and resources to ensure their success.

In 2014, the Children's Home opened the Madison Youth Ranch in north Florida. The Youth Ranch provides specialized residential care, similar to our Enterprise


campus, but with the addition of an Equine Assisted Therapy program. Typically, this type of therapy is a team effort where our therapist works with an equine specialist. As the youth learn themselves and tend to open up more to their therapist. Equine Assisted Therapy has been shown to treat a wide range of issues and can be especially effective with children who have difficulty opening up to a therapist about their trauma.

In an effort to expand our service continuum to families and children across Florida, in 2019 the Children's Home acquired Circle of Friends Services, a non-profit community health provider. This has allowed us to provide needed services to more children who are dealing with abuse, neglect, domestic violence, and other difficulties, and provide those services in their home, at their school, as well as in a clinical setting. During the recent pandemic, the Circle of Friends professionals were able to continue providing care through virtual visits.

In 2020, we were asked by ChildNet, a foster care lead agency operating in Palm Beach and Broward Counties, to assume the operations and management of their emergency intake program called Safe Place. The eight bed shelter provides meals, clothing, and short term care while a child transfers to a foster home or other placement.

Remember to include any charities that are important to you in your plan. If you have given during life, then consider providing for these organizations through your estate. Ask us about plans like charitable remainder trusts and gift annuities that can help your family and our mission.

6. VISIT YOUR ATTORNEY

Bring the information you have gathered and questions to your attorney. Your attorney can draft a will or trust that will achieve your goals. You complete the plan through a simple signing process.

CORRECTION TO OUR ANNUAL REPORT

ENDOWMENT FUNDS AT THE CHILDREN’S HOME

An endowment fund is a permanent, self-sustaining source of funding. Endowed assets are invested, and each year, a portion of the value of the fund is paid out to support the operations of the Children’s Home. Any earnings in excess of this distribution are used to build the fund’s market value. In this way, an endowed fund can grow and provide support for its designated purpose in perpetuity. When an endowed fund is established, a permanent legacy of support is created for the Children’s Home.
