Our Therapeutic Residential Care Program provides care and a family style home for school-aged children who have been victimized by abuse, neglect or family trauma, and provides education, counseling, as well as recreation and ministry opportunities. Residing Hope also provides Foster Care, an Independent Living Program as well as a Montessori-based early childhood program to the public.
